Key Evaluation Findings of CSP:

- Relationship-based partnership improves resident perceptions of safety
- Reduced dangerous conditions that fuel violent crime
- Not limited to gang violence, can also be used for other chronic issues such as homelessness

LANSING - Legislation allow ing police to conduct roadside drug testing is being considered in Michigan. The initiative was spearheaded by family members of an Escaraim. couple who were killed when their carwas struck by a scali driver later. convicted of driving with the presence of a controlled substance.

Tom and Barbaro Swift, each 73 of Escanaba, died of inturies suffered when their car was hit by a logging truck driven by Harley Davidson Durecher, 26, of Little Lake, who failed to stop at a red light. 





